

### **Pollokshields East (traffic regulation) order 201\_**

Glasgow City Council propose to consider the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The area affected by this proposal is generally bounded by:

Shields Road, Nithsdale Road, Darnley Street and St Andrews Road.

The roads affected by these proposals are:

Albert Drive, Aytoun Road, Barcaldine Street, Bruce Road, Darnley Road, Darnley Street, Forth Street, Glenapp Street, Glencairn Drive, Herriet Street, Keir Street, Kenmure Street, Kildrostan Street, Leslie Road, Leslie Street, Leven Street, Maxwell Drive, Maxwell Road, Mellville Street, McCulloch Street, Nithsdale Place, Nithsdale Road, St Andrews Road, Shields Road, Terregles Avenue.

Details of the proposals are as follows:

Glasgow City Council recognise that obstructive parking within the area is restricting pedestrians and vehicle movements at all junctions and believe these proposals will address this issue and also improve road safety and pedestrian safety in the area.

The main features of the proposals are:

- No waiting at any time and no loading or unloading at any time
- One-way operations
- No waiting at any time and no loading or unloading except by goods vehicles.
